#### SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

**Eric Brunstrom, Aiken, St. Louis & Siljeg, P.S.** – Eric focuses much of his practice on matters involving trusts, probate and guardianship litigation. He has extensive experience handling cases brought under the Trust and Estate Dispute Resolution Act (TEDRA), guardianship disputes and vulnerable adult issues. He represents clients in estate planning, including special needs trusts, in trust and probate administration matters, and in Social Security and Medicaid entitlement cases. The balance of Eric’s practice is focused on representing health care professionals before licensure and credentialing boards, as well as providing representation in most health law related matters to clients ranging from individual to large regional providers.

He serves as a Guardian ad Litem under Title 11 and in Probate and Settlement matters. He is the 2016/2017 Chair of the Guardianship and Elder Law Section of the King County Bar Association.
