SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

Jennifer Keilin, MSW, LICSW – Jennifer has been in private practice since 2003, conducting parenting plan evaluations and substance abuse assessments, as well as providing case management/parent coordination services. Jennifer also provides co-parent coaching to parents with conflicted relationships or individuals/couples parenting with a difficult ex-partner.

Jayne Hulse, MPH, LMHC – Jayne D. Hulse, MPH University of Washington 1987, after eight years with Family Court Services for the King County Superior Court, has been in private practice since 1998

providing child focused-mediation, arbitration, evaluation, counseling, consultation, case management and Title 26 guardian ad litem services. She conducts agreed and court-ordered parenting plan evaluations to determine the best outcome for the children, mediates with parents in developing or modifying parenting plans, provides reunification and co-parenting counseling for parents and children, and serves as a team member in collaborative divorce cases, a case manager in complex post decree cases and as an arbitrator of parenting plan conflicts. Her training with Dr. Jennifer McIntosh in Australia and Seattle based work in child-focused and child-inclusive mediation informs how she assists all families after separation creating a positive co-parenting relationship. She has handled more than 600 mediations and 400 parenting plan evaluations and domestic violence assessments. Jayne is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor in Washington State and has been a presenter and coach at various professional forums since 1994.

Michael Loudon, Wechsler Becker, LLP – Michael Loudon’s practice focuses on mediation and arbitration of family law disputes. He has over 20 years of experience as a family law litigator. He has served as a Guardian ad Litem and Court Appointed Special Advocate for children in family law cases. He has served as a pro tem family law commissioner since 2003. He was chair of the King County Bar Association’s Family Law Section in 1999, and chaired the section’s legislative committee for over 15 years. He regularly presents at CLE’s for other family law attorneys. He serves as a mentor for new attorneys through the King County Bar Association Family Law Mentor Program.

Judge Jean A. Rietschel, King County Superior Court – Judge Jean A. Rietschel was appointed as a judge at King County Superior Court by former Governor Christine Gregoire in 2010. She is presently serving as the Chief of Family Law. She has done prior rotations in Civil, Criminal and Family Law. Judge Rietschel received the 2011 Vanguard Award from King County’s Washington Women’s Lawyers. In 2001 she received the 2001 Seattle Works Award. She has chaired the King County Trial Court Coordinating Committee, the Regional Law Safety and Justice Committee., and the Best Practices Committee. Prior to her appointment to Superior Court she served as a Judge and as the Presiding Judge in Seattle Municipal Court. As an attorney she worked in her own solo practice, for Institutional Legal Services, and for the Public Defenders’ office. Judge Rietschel received an undergraduate degree from the University of Rochester in philosophy and a J.D. from the University of Washington School of Law.
