SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

Rachel Felbeck, Law Office of Rachel L Felbeck – Rachel Felbeck has been practicing family law since 1995 and is the founder of the Collaborative Divorce movement in Washington State. Rachel has also been a leader in helping to reduce the cost and complexity of the divorce process for families who are not adversarial.

During her career, she directly witnessed the trauma families would experience when participating in a litigated divorce. As a result, she developed a strong interest in several forms of dispute resolution, all of which are designed to help families solve their divorce issues without having to go to Court. This allows separating couples to be more involved in the solutions to their disputes, save time and money and move forward in a post-divorce situation with security and stability.

Joanna Roth, Family Transition Center, SPC – Joanna Roth currently serves on the executive committee of the Washington State Bar Alternative Dispute Resolution Section. She has served on the board of King County Collaborative Law, and has chaired its Civil Practice Group. She graduated from Harvard College with honors, and earned her JD at the University of Washington. While in law school, she worked for the Department of Education Office for Civil Rights and co-founded the Center for Human Rights and Justice. She was honored to receive a travel fellowship from the University of Washington to examine native political organizations throughout Polynesia.

Sara Wahl, Sara K. Wahl, Attorney at Law, PLLC – Sara K. Wahl opened her own law practice in December 2010, where she is focusing her practice on Collaborative Divorce and Family Law, cooperative family law, mediation, custody, and other general family law legal matters. Prior to opening her own law firm, Sara was a partner and the head of the family law department at Hanis, Irvine, Prothero PLLC. Sara has handled countless family law cases from simple child support issues to complex custody trials. Sara has been practicing Collaborative family law since 2005, with the intention to preserve the family relationships. She was the first attorney qualified to practice Collaborative Family Law in the entire South King County area. She is also a professionally trained mediator, as well as a Title 26 Family Law Guardian ad Litem.

Sara is a member of King County Bar Association – Trustee, Board of Directors, 2013-2017; Collaborative Professionals of Washington, Board Member; The International Academy of Collaborative Professionals, Member; and King County Collaborative Law, Membership Chair. Additionally, Sara was a member of the Washington State Bar Association’s Lawyer’s Assistance Program Committee for 6 years. Sara is a volunteer attorney at the King County Bar Association’s Greenwood Family Law Clinic, and a volunteer as a Family Law Facilitator at the King County Superior Court. Since 2002 and every year following, Sara has received the Pro Bono Service Commendation from the Washington State Bar Association for providing pro bono legal services to low income clients.

Sara graduated from Seattle University in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice. She was a member of the Criminal Justice Honor Society. She attended Seattle University School of Law, where she earned her J.D. in 1999. When she isn’t working to bring awareness to the community about Collaborative Law, Sara is also an animal advocate with a local dog rescue organization, working to rescue dogs from high-kill shelters.
