SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

Judge Kimberley Prochnau (Ret.) - Judge Prochnau is a mediator, arbitrator and special master at JAMS after over 20 years as a judge, commissioner and pro-tem judge with the King County Superior Court. At JAMS, Judge Prochnau handles cases involving family law, estate/probate, employment and business matter. As a judge, she presided over class actions; complex civil, criminal, juvenile and family law cases; condominium and other real estate matters; torts; contractual disputes; and TEDRA, probate and guardianship cases. As a court commissioner, she sat on the ex parte and probate, family law, juvenile and civil commitment calendars. Prior to becoming a commissioner, Judge Prochnau had a diverse practice as a lawyer.

Commissioner Eric Watness (Ret.) - Commissioner Watness is a mediator, arbitrator and special master at JAMS where he regularly handles matters involving guardianship, probate, trust and family issues. He brought to his ADR practice 16 years of experience as Court Commissioner with the King County Superior Court in their Ex Parte and Probate Department and Juvenile Court Department. Prior to becoming a commissioner, he was in private practice for 13 years with an emphasis on family law, probate, adult guardianship, and adoptions. He began his legal career as an Assistant Attorney General

for the Washington State Attorney General where he represented the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services.
