SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

Jacqueline Jeske, Jeske Dispute Resolution LLC - Jacqueline L. Jeske was appointed to the King County Superior Court bench as a family law commissioner in 2008 and served on a variety of calendars including family law, domestic violence, juvenile court and mental illness until 2017. After leaving the court in January 2017 she started Jeske Dispute Resolution LLC and currently provides mediation and arbitration services in King and Snohomish counties. Prior to her appointment, she was in both criminal and civil practice for over twenty years. With a background as a criminal Deputy Prosecuting Attorney for Snohomish County, a Public Defender for the City of Bellevue and previously in private family practice, she has extensive experience at the municipal, district and superior court levels.

Prior to joining the King County Superior Court, she served as a Senior Deputy Prosecuting Attorney with the King County Prosecuting Attorney’s Office, Family Support Unit. Ms. Jeske obtained her Juris Doctorate degree the University of Washington and holds Bachelor of Art from degrees from U.C. Davis in International Relations and in the Spanish Language. She was a longtime member of the Superior Court Judge’s Association - Family and Juvenile Law Committee, the King County Domestic Violence and

Child Maltreatment Coordinated Response Project Oversight Committee, the SCJA Family and Juvenile Law Legislative Committee, the Supreme Court Commission on Foster Care, Dependency Best Practices Committee and the King County Superior Court's Family Law, Trauma and Interpreter Committees. She has engaged in appellate work throughout her career and has argued successfully before the Washington State Supreme Court.
