SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

Susan Edison, Washington State Office of the Attorney General-Bankruptcy & Collections – Susan Edison was admitted to practice in Washington in 1988 and joined the Attorney General’s Office in 1989 where she spent over 22 years working in the Torts Division. In 2015, Susan joined the Bankruptcy and Collections Unit where she represents the Washington State Taxing Agencies and the Department of Social and Health Services primarily in Chapter 13 bankruptcy cases. Susan holds a J.D. from the University of Washington and a B.A. in History and Economics from Stanford University.

Dina Yunker Frank, Washington State Office of the Attorney General-Bankruptcy & Collections – Admitted to practice in Washington in 1987, Dina maintained a commercial litigation practice before joining the Attorney General’s office in 1993. Upon joining, she helped establish the Bankruptcy and

Collections Unit, where she represented the state taxing agencies and advised the Attorney General's Consumer Protection, Ecology, and Natural Resources divisions. In 2002, Dina joined the AG's University of Washington division, where she provided business-related health law advice to UW Medicine. Dina returned to the Bankruptcy & Collections Unit in 2018, where her practice focuses on chapter 11 cases and superior court receivership matters. She holds a J.D. from Seattle University and a B.A. in Political Science from Montana State University.

Angie Lee, Washington State Office of the Attorney General-Bankruptcy & Collections – Angie was admitted to practice in California in 2007 and in Washington in 2014. Angie was a business litigator in Los Angeles representing Chapter 7 trustees, banks, finance lenders, and businesses in state, federal and bankruptcy courts. After moving to Washington, Angie was a solo practitioner providing general counsel services to small businesses and representing bankruptcy debtors and personal injury claimants. In 2019, Angie joined the AGO's Bankruptcy & Collections Unit, where she primarily represents the Washington State taxing agencies in chapter 7 bankruptcies, receiverships, probates, foreclosures, and contractor bond actions. Angie holds a J.D. from the University of San Diego and a B.S. in Finance and Marketing from New York University.
