SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

Jamie Clausen, Phinney Estate Law - Jamie Clausen founded Phinney Estate Law in 2007 as a way of addressing a need she saw in the community for affordable, values-based estate planning and as a way to develop a legal practice that was consistent with her own values and legal philosophy. Jamie works with her clients to develop their estate plans and heads the firm’s probate and dispute resolution practices. A leader in the alternative dispute resolution community, she acts as a mediator and collaborative attorney in probates and elder law disputes. Before founding Phinney Estate Law, Jamie worked as a litigation associate at Cozen O’Connor, as an attorney advisor for the U.S. Department of Justice, and as legal intern for Northwest Immigration Rights Project and Northwest Justice Project. Jamie serves as a volunteer attorney facilitator for the ex-parte probate and guardianship calendar in King County. Jamie is a member of the Washington State Bar Association sections on Probate and Elder Law. She is also a member of the King County Bar Association sections on Probate and Elder Law. She was the former Chair of the King County Bar Association Collaborative Law Section. Jamie is a former professor at Edmonds Community College where she taught classes on Probate, Estate Planning, and Elder Law.
