**SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY**

Before founding Phinney Estate Law, Jamie worked as a litigation associate at Cozen O’Connor, as an attorney advisor for the U.S. Department of Justice, and as legal intern for Northwest Immigration Rights Project and Northwest Justice Project. Jamie serves as a volunteer attorney facilitator for the ex-parte probate and guardianship calendar in King County.

Jamie is a member of the Washington State Bar Association sections on Probate and Elder Law. She is also a member of the King County Bar Association sections on Probate and Elder Law. She was the former Chair of the King County Bar Association Collaborative Law Section. Jamie is a former professor at Edmonds Community College where she taught classes on Probate, Estate Planning, and Elder Law.
