### SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

**Chief Judge David S. Mann, Washington State Court of Appeals, Division One** – Judge David S. Mann was appointed to the Court of Appeals effective August 16, 2016 by Governor Jay Inslee, and elected in November, 2017. Judge Mann became Chief Judge of Division I in April 2020. Judge Mann received degrees in geology and physics from the University of California, Santa Barbara and then worked as a professional geophysicist for six years before attending law school. Mann is a 1991 graduate of Lewis and Clark Law. For 25 years before his appointment Judge Mann was a trial and appellate lawyer with an emphasis on state and federal environmental, land-use, real property, and administrative law, including access to government and access to public records. In addition to his duties with Division I, Judge Mann serves on the Court of Appeals Executive Committee and the statewide Board of Judicial Administration (BJA).

**Lea Ennis, Washington State Court of Appeals, Division One** – Lea Ennis is the Court Administrator/Clerk of Division I, Court of Appeals. Prior to joining the Court of Appeals in 2021, she worked for King County Superior Court for 26 years where she served in several different positions, including Director of Juvenile Court Services, Director of Technology and Director of Court Operations. Ms. Ennis earned her Master of Public Administration and Bachelor of Arts in Comparative Literature from the University of Washington.
