SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY:

Chris Goelz, Circuit Mediator, Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals Mediation Program – Chris has been a mediator for the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals for over twenty years. Before joining the court’s mediation program, Chris worked in the court’s motions unit. Before that, he was a litigator in a small San Francisco firm. Chris graduated from Yale Law School and has an undergraduate degree in engineering. He is an author of a Ninth Circuit practice guide published by the Rutter Group.

Judge Anne L. Ellington (ret.), JAMS – Judge Ellington served on the Washington State Court of Appeals, Division I, from May of 1995 until November of 2012, after almost 11 years on the King County Superior Court. She tried hundreds of cases and authored hundreds of opinions. She has also served as a Pro Tem Justice on the State Supreme Court. She has been a frequent speaker on topics including trial and appellate practice, employment, tort, and contract law. She was also instrumental in improving access to justice, both as Presiding Judge of the Superior Court and as a member of the Access to Justice. Judge Ellington has a stellar reputation for being an exceptional listener and for her fairness. Judge Ellington is a member of the JAMS panel of neutrals handling mediation, arbitration, neutral analysis and discovery master matters.
